

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

I certainly hope you and your family had a great Christmas and are preparing for an outstanding new year. As we look forward to 2024, the popularity of the C8 and the continued growth of QCCC makes the outlook for the club even brighter. This is an exciting time to be a Corvette enthusiast! With so many new members, I'm going to concentrate the next few months on the early history of the club, which will celebrate its 56th year of continuous operation this August. How did we get here?

Let's go back 60 years to 1964, in terms of this club, prehistoric. There was a state-wide Corvette club "*Corvette Club of North Carolina*" operating at this time, mostly made up of 30-40 year old young professionals that were promoting the brand and had a few events, mostly social, throughout the state. But the idea of a local club for younger Corvette owners had not yet been thought of.

Enter our founder, Earl Ferrell. In 1964, Earl was graduating from high school and was cruising thru Shoney's and BarBQ-King in a nice '55 Chevy. Earl and his high school sweetheart, Martha Rushing, were preparing to be married. In 1965 the couple settled into a nice apartment in North Charlotte and Earl landed a good job with International Harvester. He sold his '55 and bought a brand new lavender '65 Chevelle Super Sport, 327 4 speed. His high school buddy, Carl Brown, already had access to a nice original 1958 Corvette that he drove to school on occasion. But when Carl purchased a brand new yellow 1966 Corvette roadster, Earl caught the "Corvette Fever". It was late in 1966, the new 1967 models were on the showroom when Earl found out that the Chevy dealer on South Boulevard had a brand new '66 coupe left over in inventory and wanted to sell it badly. Earl traded the Chevelle and finally had his dream car. His coupe was silver with silver interior, a 327, 350 horsepower 4 speed. He immediately added off road side exhausts and a set of American mags. The car was stunning!

Back then when you purchased a new Corvette, you got a free subscription to "*Corvette News*" magazine published by Chevrolet and edited by world-class brand promoter, Joe Pike. Even though there were a few established Corvette Clubs in the US, Joe was responsible for forming the National Council of Corvette Clubs in 1958 and organizing clubs throughout the country. In *Corvette News*, he detailed how to start a Corvette Club, putting together bi-laws, recruiting members, hosting events and making a positive impact in the community. This got Earl's interest and he and Carl decided to give it a try.

The summer of 1968, Earl and Carl had recruited one of Earl's neighbors and a guy they met in the service lane at LaPointe Chevrolet to form the Queen City Corvette Club. Earl was elected the first President. The word spread and since Charlotte was not so large back then, most of the local Corvette owners knew each other and the club grew to about twenty members quickly. When Earl found out that I purchased my '64 coupe in 1970, he called me and invited me to attend a club rally where Sharon and I placed second and met some great people. We joined later that year and became very involved.

Earl never stopped promoting the club even when he became very ill with cancer. He fought like hell, but finally passed away in 1987 at the age of 41.

Next month, we'll go back 50 years to 1974, a crazy period for QCCC! You know the saying, "If you remember the 70's you weren't there".

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Some of the Others

If you don't have the masses you will fail to exist. This month we will look at some of those who were great attendees, but chose not to be the "face" of QCCC.

Buzz Cagle: Buzz had a red '69 427 435 horse Corvette that was all that and more. Side exhaust let you know he was coming. *(photo #1)* Buzz had a car detailing shop on the boulevard and he would check in with the auto dealers every a.m. to get any cars they took on trade the day before. Then he would go pick them up one at a time, steam the engine, detail the paint and interior, return that one for another. His first shop was across from the QCCC clubhouse and was actually how we found out it was for rent. So Buzz was about 40 years ahead of the rest of the world in car care. He was a type A, high strung even more than Clark. Buzz was instrumental in getting several QCCC members to caravan to the National Convention for NCCC in Dallas, Texas in 1972. He attended a lot of QCCC events but his work kept him from outside duties like the board. Buzz accepted our invitation to come to our 48 birthday meeting and said he was trying to find his old car to buy it back. We remember him always referring to his wife as the little Hen. He was a great guy and plenty of laughs!

Easy Ed Sloan: Easy Ed, so named due to his laid-back approach to life, had a '66 roadster that he was always working on so we did not see that much of him. Of note, he was our bartender for two years. To be a good bartender you had to pour a good beer with no or little head. Ed was slow moving and talking but he would fill it up to the brim with no head. Ed was quiet but would engage in talk in the bar. I found out he had a '66 with air that he wanted to race so he had taken the factory air out and thrown it in the corner. I was able to buy every nut and bolt for a total of \$150. I shipped it to Damon Smith at Central Illinois Corvettes to put on his '65 coupe. *(photo #2)* We last saw Ed at the sports bar in South Charlotte, Jack and Jill's or something like that. He saw all the Corvettes and asked if it was QCCC saying he used to belong. His blonde girlfriend made the evenings more pleasurable. *(photo #3: That's Ed just over David Morse in the bluer jacket, you can just see his face and shoulder)*

Bill & Jennie Murray: Almost 30, they were nicknamed Captain America and wife. This was due to the stars on the paint job on their '69 coupe, *(photo #4)* seen parked by the Sunoco gas station at Charlotte Motor Speedway during the '77 Porsche – Corvette Challenge. Bill was a diesel mechanic and she was a legal secretary. With 2 baby girls, time constraints were probably the cause of them dropping out after a few years.

Pete & Peggy Walther: I met them late December '74. They had a huge St. Bernard and I agreed to dog sit him for a weekend. That was a disaster! They had a '71 big block with a custom paint job on the hood and front fenders. *(photo #5)* In March, I agreed to trailer their car to the Tweetsie Mountain Hill Climb, which was up and down the service road on the back side. It was a 6 foot wide service road used to get food to the customers in the park. There was a tree in the middle of the road at the bottom. You could go either side but make up your mind early. C-3's would go up the hill rather quickly with lots of power, but coming down you found out Chevrolet's brakes were behind horsepower in engineering.

I filmed that day from a spot on the mountain where about 12 Corvettes slammed the rocks on the passenger side, rather than going over the driver side edge which went down very quickly. Pete's car was one of them. We loaded what was left of the car which was minus a right front fender and headed home. (*photo #6: Pete is standing by their car right behind the Y in the parade sign while Peggy is standing at the back of their car*) She is lined up directly behind the U in the sign. You can see the nose of their car just behind the sign with the custom paint job. This was at the old Carowinds Thanksgiving day parade circa '75

Rick Wilson: Rick was wide open and funny. His claim to fame was at Myrtle Beach weekend event. After it was over he decided it would fun to take a drive in his '63 roadster up and down the incoming surf. This was great until the blue lights flashed; however, it did have a good outcome as the officer told us to go visit the Mayor and get a permit to race on the beach. Result, we set up the Sandkahna in 1977 October. His other minute of fame came when he got us thrown out of Lanny's tavern where Central Ave. dead ended at Albemarle. Rick would holler loudly a dirty word, some would laugh but the manager did not. (*photo #7 & 8: Rick was quite the guy and was always dancing in the clubhouse with the juke box and Rick driving in the surf*)

Bill Henderson: AKA Spyder Man. Bill worked for the phone company and Kathy was a legal secretary. She along with Dollar Bill Ingram got us incorporated in '76. Bill was known for taking a new '72, stripping the interior and then respraying the orange paint with red then dripping black paint on so that it looked like a spider web or he ran thru a freshly oiled road. Also, at the drags in S.C. he blew an engine and to get home he put his car on Trav's trailer then he drove Trav's drag car close to the back of the trailer as Trav's car had no insurance and open headers.
