





QCCC HISTORY

My wife of almost 56 years is not a Corvette enthusiast. She knew when she met me that I was an over the hill gear head but I guess she loved me and I found her irresistible, so we got married. She endured my passion for cars, attending all types of car related events, shows and races. I had exposed this sweet young thing to all of the loud sounds, dirt, smells, intoxicated rednecks and vulgar language associated with racing back then and she went along willingly. I was headed toward turning my '68 396 Chevelle into an all out drag car when Corvette fever struck me and I had to have one. After failing at ordering a new 1970 Corvette, mainly because of a union strike and insurance costs, I found the '64 coupe I still have today. When I surprised her with the purchase, she thought I had lost my mind. My buddy, Jim Whitley, who had purchased a '69 Corvette told me about OCCC. We attended a road rally as guests, had a great time and joined the club. I have to give Sharon a lot of credit, in the early years she went with me to all of the club functions, including the races, with grace and patience. She certainly enjoyed the parties and the road trips, but the car stuff was not her cup of tea. In fact, when the doctor came in and said "it's a boy", the first thing she said to me was, "You have a son, now I won't have to go to any more races". What was different about being in the club were the friendships that were developed and she found herself becoming great friends with the other members. As the old saying goes, "we came for the car and stayed for the people". After our third child was born we finally dropped out in the early 80's to raise our family.

Fast forward to 2011, when we re-joined QCCC. The kids are on their own raising their own families and we are certainly enjoying being grandparents. And once again the Club has become an important part of our lives, renewing old friendships and making new ones. And I still get my Corvette fix and Sharon still likes the parties and road trips. But she has found a unique way to participate in the car stuff. If you have attended the club's car shows, the last ten or twelve Auto Fairs, the Americarna car show and various other car events, you might have seen the red square cookie tin with the QCCC logo on it. Inside are her "car show" homemade brownies. The reason they are designated "car show" brownies is she is famous for her brownies for all sorts of occasions. More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past

Boyd Kurt: '09 & '10 avg. members 249

Boyd was vice president serving under Q. They say competition makes you better, and those two are pretty competitive. The new club forming in Charlotte in '07 was a challenge to our presidents to not lose too many members plus putting a dent in our acquiring new members. Folks had a choice and it could get intense when some left and others had to decide to go or stay. So Boyd along with Q had to focus on delivering what the members needed. Boyd is a people person and you could not have a better leader to getting the numbers back up. He turned to humor and got everybody to chill out. Along with the C-6 hitting full stride we survived and made room for not one but two new clubs. You can see the membership rose to 249 with a bright future. He really enjoyed entertaining with the help of Mr. Sock. He says that growing the club was his most enjoyable time and losing members to the new clubs, sometimes close friends was the most difficult. Boyd stepped down after 2 years but continued by becoming newsletter editor.

Steve Pelchat: 2011 – 2012, members 215-288

He was a quiet leader but a serious Corvette Junky. Steve was easy going and I remember he would always say, "ok everybody, find a chair. Let's get this meeting over with so we can go eat. He never had a long meeting but kept on a level path. We were just steady. The past was behind us and we had moved on quite nicely.

Biggest Challenge: As we got more deeply involved with the National Corvette Museum with Paul Mariano as our ambassador, things were happening and finances were tight. (remember the economy was lousy then) Would it be great if the Corvette clubs would help us to build our own race track? The NCM ask for clubs to pony up \$15,000 to buy one acre of land where the track is now. Several of our members dug deep and bought their own acre. The Becker's for one. We only 144 families so it was a tough sell. Steve is pretty persuasive. We made it. Again, remember only ½ our members belong to NCM. It does not sound like much but when we start collecting at every meeting it gets thin very quickly. I believe Steve as the first president that had issues with the size of the membership causing us to struggle to find meeting places. Also, Steve was the person with the creative thought to have a small coral at our car show for same owner for over 50 years, a great tribute to these members.

Steve has had some health issues so was not able to respond, so this is from my best memory.

Best wishes for improved health, we miss you.

Keith Cross: 2013-2014, members 301-329

Keith had a great presidency. I know because I was there as his V.P. in 2014. He held the 45th birthday party with the theme of "Cruisin' the Carolinas since 1968". Keith then got this added to our logo. He got a new board position of

Member-at-Large to be available to sub in if a board member has to drop out. Keith was without a V.P. for most of 2013. He was a great leader in donations and the NCM was moving fast on the race track. Keith got donations for a QCCC granite bench at NCM plus a brick donated when a member passes. He got us in the banner program at NCM where we have a QCCC light pole banner changed out every 2 years and the old one we auction off for charity. See one at Tommy's garage at the April business meeting. NCM was moving fast and we were now a major player thanks to Paul Marino and Keith. Time for QCCC to become a lifetime NCM member, more donations. The museum was engraving names on the floors, on the walls, on the granite benches, just about every where and Keith had QCCC all over the place.

Speed bumps: We had two wives that were granted Lifetime Membership status. It wasn't that did not deserve it, but they sold their Corvette. We were starting a slippery slope here as this could lead to some problems. Keith came up with the Lifetime Achievement Award and we cancelled the Lifetime Membership. At that time if member sold their Corvette he/she had until the end of the current year 12/31 plus a maximum of 12 more months to acquire a Corvette. The Lifetime Service Award qualification probably needed some fine tuning. (Currently, there are similar awards; however, qualifications have changed through the years.) Also, the staff position of Historian was created in 2014 and Travis has done a bang up job with it. The Vintage member jacket patch was created after starting out as a jacket, a great reward for members active for 15 years. We knew we had to retain folks to be able to help our newer members. Charities were cut from about six to two in order to be more manageable. See a candid photo of Keith posing as a Porsche Race Driver.




