If anyone has any ideas for the remainder of the year please call me to see if we can arrange it.

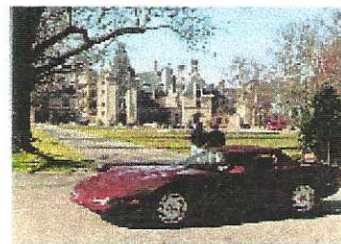
The following is the clue for the \$200 for July:

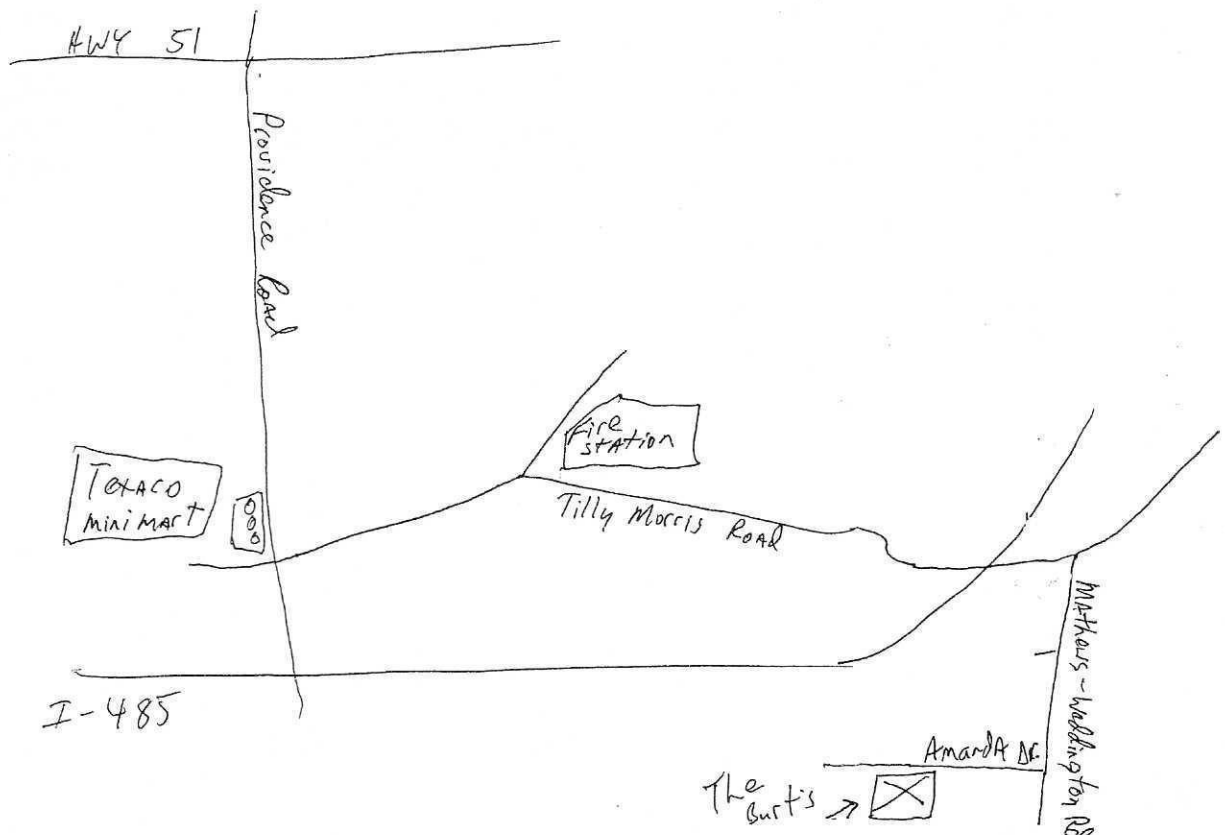

Carolina Region Sports Car Challenge

Solo Time Trials

September 4th and 5th, 1999 Carolina Motorsports Park Kershaw, SC

Entry Fee: \$145 before August 24th, \$175 after, limited to 70 entrants

The Carolina Region of the National Council of Corvette Clubs is extending an invitation to the Viper, Porsche, BMW and SCCA club members for some friendly competition at the new 2.4 mile road course. The track is located five miles south of Kershaw off hwy 521. This will be conducted similar to the SCCA Solo I events which will include warm-up laps each morning, 3 car pods and three timed laps per event. The fastest lap will count towards an award. Entrants will be divided into four groups for awards:

- **Showroom Stock** - NCCC Group 1, SCCA showroom stock or touring; DOT approved tires; no modifications to the suspension, engine, brakes, transmission; wheels must maintain same offset and size; mufflers can be any commercially available mounted in the original location; minor body and engine trim accessories that don't improve the performance of the vehicle.
- **Improved Touring** - NCCC Group 2, SCCA improved touring; DOT approved tires, tire and wheel size open; allowed modifications: suspension can be improved within OEM's original configuration including tower bars and camber plates, fuel cell, E-PROM, radiator, aircleaner, oil pan/coolers/accu-sump: may update/backdate using OE crossbreed parts for engine of same type for vehicle, engine stroke stock, may bore to .070max., header exhaust; removal of air-conditioning, pollution equip., minor engine, interior and exterior trim allowed; lightened composite body panels not allowed.
- **Modified** - NCCC Group 3 Modified, SCCA street prepared and street modified; slicks allowed; IT modifications plus: must use same type of engine for vehicle although engine modifications are open including aftermarket parts. Customizing allowed if it doesn't significantly lighten the body, frame must be stock but reinforcing is allowed, brakes and suspension can be modified within original configuration. Basically a street type vehicle. **DRIVERS MUST WEAR A FIRESUIT** with a minimum rating of SFI-3.2A-1, gloves and socks SFI-3.3-1. Vehicle must have a roll bar meeting your clubs specifications and five point harness.
- **Race Prepared** - NCCC Group 3 RP/RPAF, SCCA production, GT and all open wheel vehicles; **MUST MEET** your clubs minimum safety requirements to include, but not limited to, a roll cage, window net or arm restraints, sealed firewall, five point harness, windscreen, firesuit, gloves and socks.

Minimum Safety Requirements include roll bars in all convertibles, Snell 85 Helmets (SA 95 recommended), BC 5 fire extinguishers mounted securely in vehicle, quick release driver's safety belt or harness. A noise limit of 105 decibels will be enforced. It is recommended that all vehicles be inspected by a qualified technician before the event and flush brake system with new fluid. All drivers must have some track or driving school experience, NCCC members must have High Speed Certificates. For technical and safety questions, please contact Bill Johnston at 704-568-6027 before 10 PM.

Registration and Tech will begin on Friday September 3rd at the track from 5-10PM and from 7AM-8AM Saturday & Sunday. Drivers meeting 7:45 AM each day.

Saturday events: 3 high speed events, three timed laps each event. CA020-1-037, -02-038, -03-039.

Sunday events: 2 high speed events, three timed laps each event. CA020-4-040, -5-041.
