



Fellow MEMBERS,


The days are flying by Now! The weather is great, and our work As A Club is just beginning!

MARCH 8, 1991, MINUTES

QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB MEETING

The Vice President called the meeting to order. Our visitors, David Farmer and Jennifer Tucker, were welcomed. We were also told that Mike and Carole Callea wanted to be voted on to become members of the club.

Clayton Williams nominated Zoe Hough for the open office of Vice President of Public Relations. The nomination was voted on and carried by a unanimous vote.

Vice President: Ricky brought up the fact that the club trailer at the present time is not road worthy. It was decided that we will wait until after convention to recondition it or look into buying a new trailer.

Some of our members have had zip code changes that the Secretary was not aware of. It was suggested that all members notify her if their zip code is different from the one on their newsletter mailing label.

Special thanks were given to all of those who sold raffle tickets at the Convention Center. A special thanks was also given to Melvin Pace and Mandy Dickson for helping sell tickets at a time when we were short on club members. We were also told that all raffle tickets need to be turned in by the end of April so they can all be taken to the National Meeting in May.

T-Shirt sales at the last National Meeting amounted to \$880. The club was also told that we had checked with the Steering Committee at the National Meeting asking for permission to be able to sell the t-shirts to the public. They said the t-shirt sales were ours, and they saw no problem with our selling them to the public if we wanted to. Therefore, t-shirts were sent to Knoxville with Roy and Sharon to be sold.

efforts in obtaining the ZR-1 to be on display at the Convention Center to help sell the raffle tickets.

Treasurer: Louise explained the reason she had a corrected copy of the Treasurer's report was to go back and bring it up-to-date properly; some members are behind on their dues and need to be brought current as soon as possible.

Secretary: All March birthdays were remembered with those present receiving a small surprise; a copy of the Bylaws with the most recent Bylaws' change was passed out to the members present and a new address list was passed out.

Convention Business: Day passes were discussed and the fact that we have a letter from the Chairman of the Steering Committee explaining exactly how the day passes work.

old Business: None.

New Business: Clayton Williams made a suggestion about having a door prize given away at each club meeting. The officers will discuss it at their next officers' meeting and have it ready for discussion at our next club meeting; Zoe Hough will make a cake for our next meeting to get our cake raffle started again.
