

We are a non-profit club, (501-C7) which raises money for and participates with various local children's charities. Dues and donations are not tax deductible. We strive to promote exciting, safe & fun ways to enjoy our Corvettes. We hold business meetings on the second Saturday of each month. Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates a social time afterwards. Our socials are always fun and are focused around food & drink. We've had swimming parties, bar-b-ques, cookouts, day trips and weekend trips. We participate in mountain tours, holiday parades and several Homecoming parades at local area high schools. We also participate with several sister Corvette clubs in car shows, drag racing, and autocrossing. After an initiation fee of \$7.00, club dues are only \$8.00 a month, per family, and are to be paid quarterly. These dues go to cover the costs of running the club, mailing newsletters, and subsidize the costs of our meetings. Club officers serve as volunteers. NCCC dues are \$30.00 a year.







### **Tech Tips**

### After-market C-5 Exhaust

I have been asked to give a report on my recently purchased exhaust system for my C5. I had been thinking about adding a new exhaust system for some time. I felt that the one thing my C5 lacked was the sound of a real Corvette. I had seen them advertised in all the magazines. There are several manufactures, Borla, Corsa, SLP and others. While on our trip to Bowling Green, KY I had the pleasure to listen the system that EO Oakley had installed on his C5. Boy, it sounded great. EO introduced me to the Corsa group while we were at Bowing Green. After hearing their sales pitch and seeing how they stand behind their product (EO had a problem with his and Corsa replaced them), I was sold on the Corsa brand.

Corsa makes two different systems for the C5, the Touring Edition (EO has this one) and the Pace Car Edition (the one I decided on). The Pace Car Edition muffler system produces a bolder sound at full throttle while the Touring Edition has a more crisp exotic car sound. Both however are extremely quiet at cruising speeds.


Next was where to buy. While still at Bowling Green, I went over to the Mid America tent to see what they had to offer. In their catalog, they had just reduced the price of the Corsa system and they were offering an additional 10% off while at the show. I took them up on their offer.

Now to the installation, it was really easy. To do the change yourself, you need a car lift or a car jack, which can lift the car up pretty high. I went with the car jack although the lift would have been better. There are a total of six bolts that have to be removed on each side. The first thing you must disconnect is the rear sway bar. There are two screws on each side. Once these are removed, the sway bar swings out of the way. Next remove the rear muffler hanger screws on both sides. After this remove the

screws holding the exhaust system to the exhaust pipes coming from the engine. After doing this all that is left is to lift the one piece (each side) from over the rear axle. This is where it helps to have the car up high to get it over the rear axle.


Putting the new one back on are much easier because it is in two pieces. First put exhaust pipes over the rear axle. Secure the front mounts with the screws that were removed earlier. From here it is easy to mount the mufflers with the screws that were supplied. Then reattach the rear hanger Screws. While holding the rear tips in alignment, tighten all screws. Reattach thew rear sway bar and tighten to specifications. Finished! In less that an hour and a half the job was done. Now my Vette sounds like what I think it should.

There is a compact disc sound track available for you to listen to many different after-market C-5 exhaust systems. See John Bayne or Buddy Ward if you want to hear the difference.


