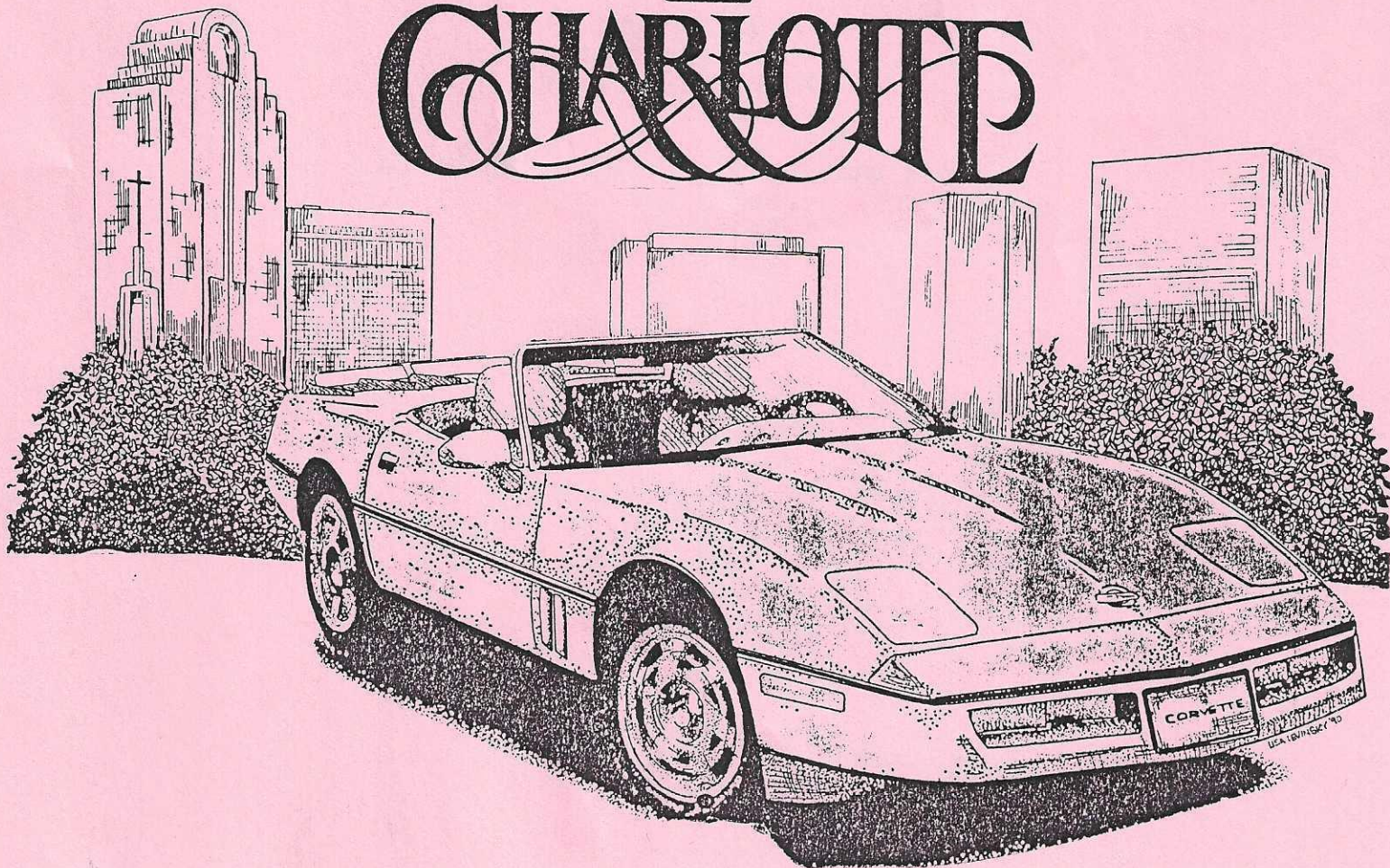

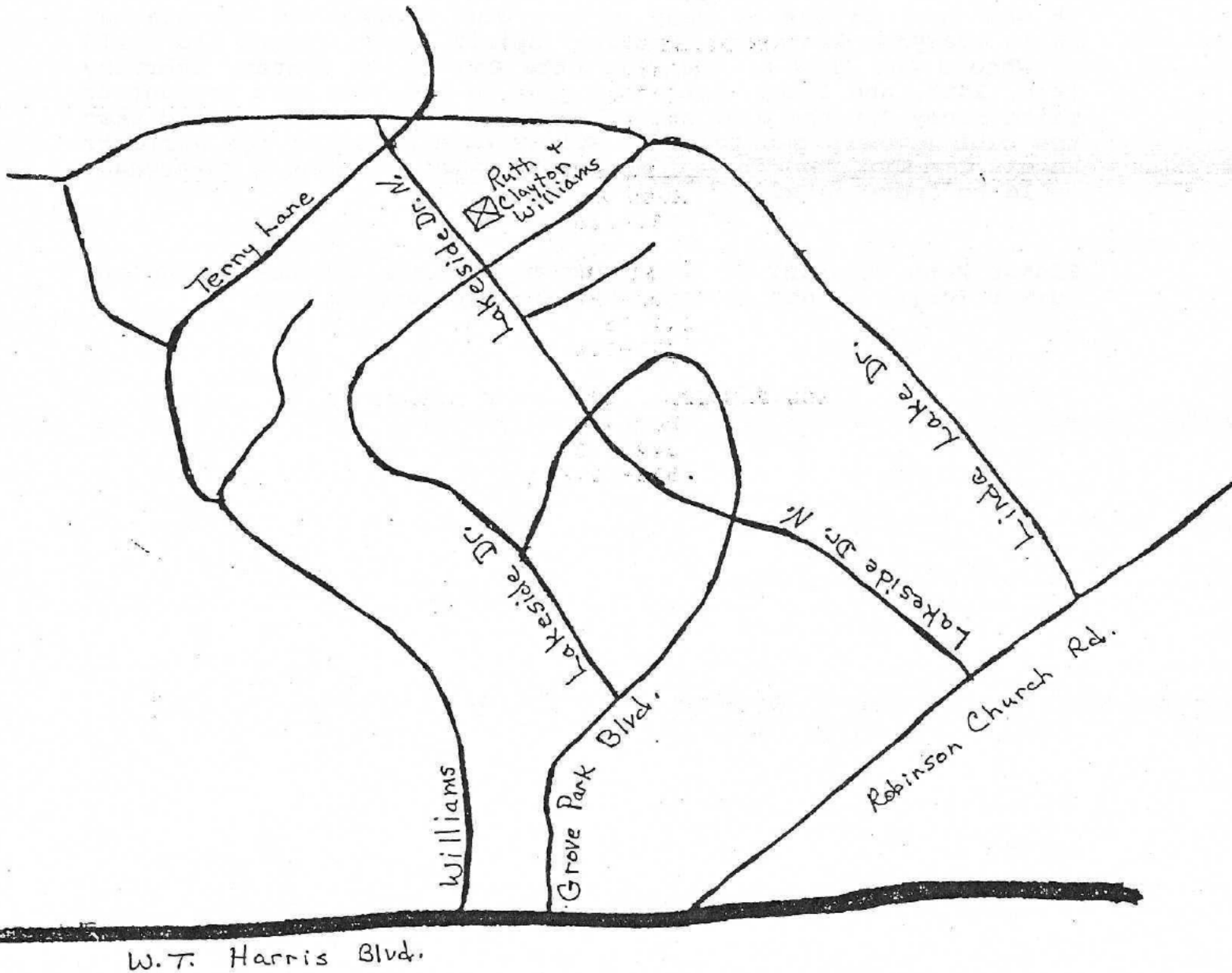

Please keep thinking of ideas and suggestions for the Spring and Summer Social Events to make 1992 and Outstanding Year!

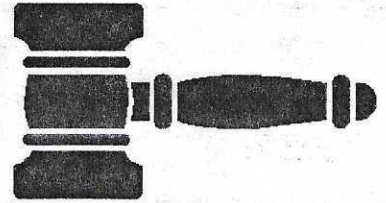

## FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

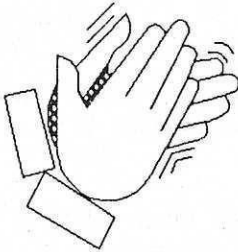

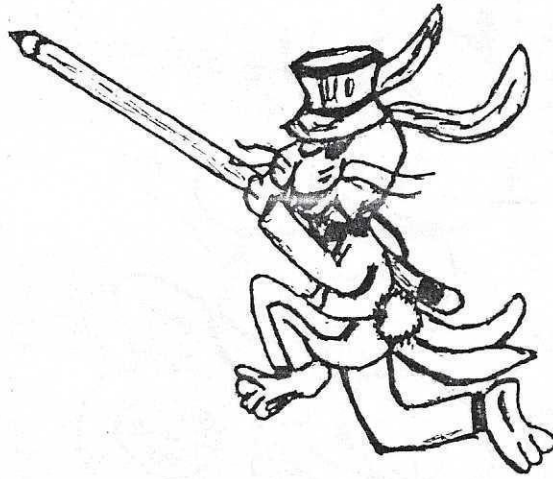
We will begin the 50/50 raffle at the February meeting. Please bring any raffle prizes that you wish to donate.

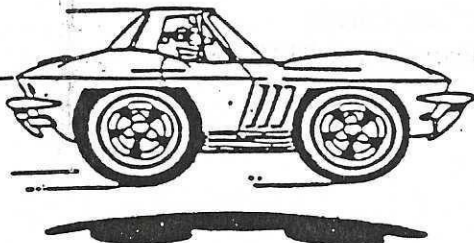

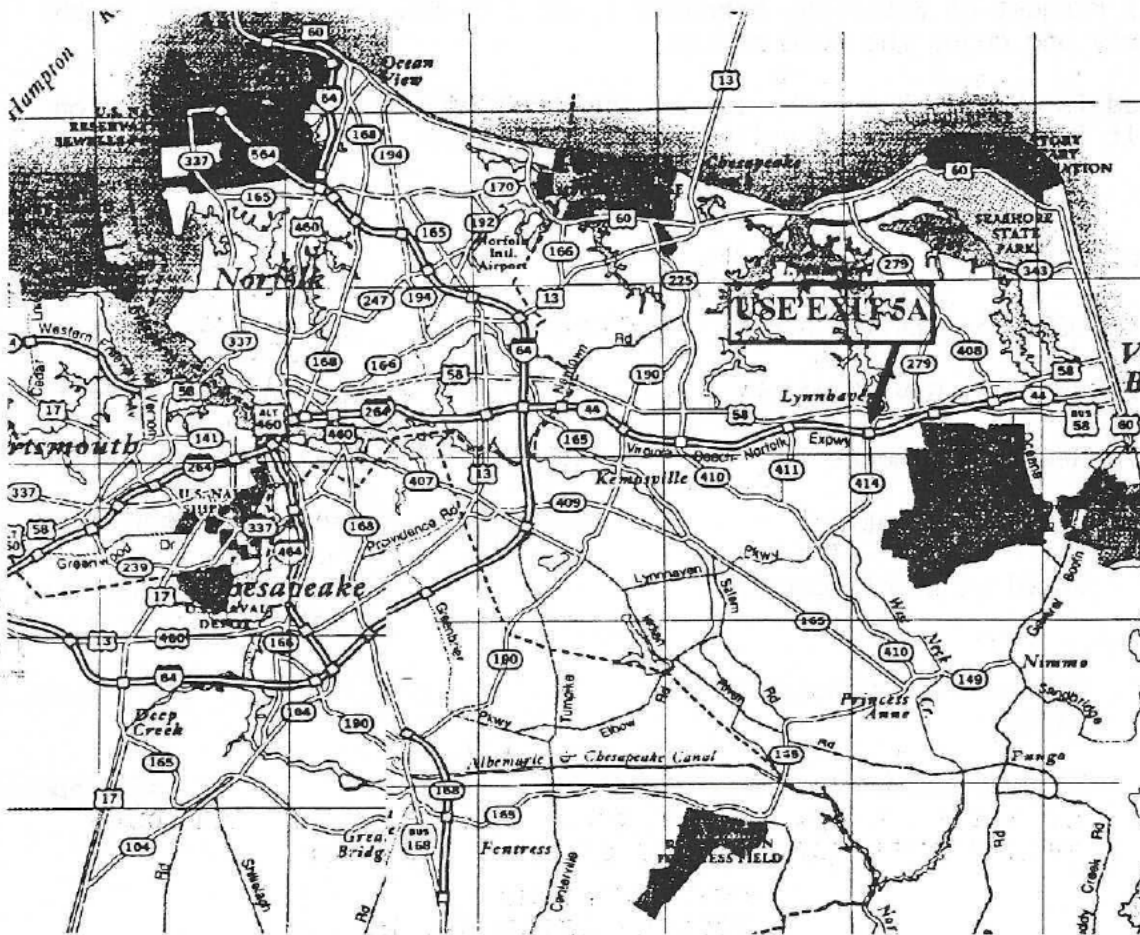

**JANUARY 10, 1992, MINUTES  
QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB MEETING**

The meeting was called to order, and the roll was called. There were 27 members present and 2 visitors. The visitors were welcomed by the President.

The minutes were read and approved for the December 7, 1991, club meeting.

**VICE PRESIDENT:** A motion was made and second to put the points system back into effect this year and it was discussed. A vote was held and the motion carried.

**SECRETARY:** Rena told all members present with birthdays in January happy birthday. She told everyone she had a better map to the Holiday Inn Center City if they needed it. She also gave out the tentative entertainment schedule for the Texas Convention in July of 1992.

**TREASURER:** Ruth Williams discussed the report that was in the newsletter in more detail. Jay Freeman told the club members that we still do not know what we made from convention. We should know something when the national meetings are held in February.

**VICE PRESIDENT PUBLIC RELATIONS:** Betty Gunter said the World of Wheels Car Show will be held February 14 - 15 at the Convention Center. Everyone who is planning to put their car in the show will have to fill out an application. We got a commitment for 10 cars.

We are trying to get a dealership to loan our club a car to help us in the selling of the raffle tickets for Spina Bifida.

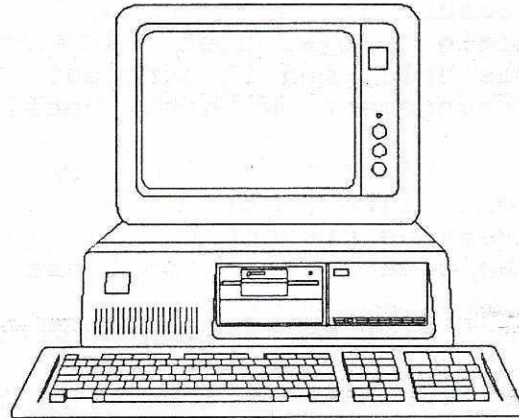
St. Patrick's Day Parade is scheduled for March 14 at 12:00. The people responsible for this parade will be sending us the information on it as soon as it is finalized.

Betty has contacted the people responsible for the 600 Festival of Lights Parade. They are now charging an entry fee for people to participate in this parade. If they need any cars for the drivers to ride on, they will be in touch with us to help them out.

We are still contacting past Queen City club members to find out if this is the year for the 25th Anniversary.

**VICE PRESIDENT OF SOCIAL:** Sharon Elgin discussed the club banquet scheduled for January 18 and asked for a commitment of everyone who was planning to attend because we were obligated to pay for the number of people that we turn in.

Vince Sciabica then took over as our new VP of Social and discussed the regional banquet to be held on Saturday, February 1, at the Marriott Hotel at I-77 and Tyvola Road. We discussed the possibility of QCCC hosting a hospitality room at the hotel for Saturday afternoon for regional members and guests attending



because it is being held in our city. A motion was made by Roy Elgin that we host a hospitality room and it was second. A vote was held, and it carried. Vince will take care of finalizing the arrangements with the hotel for the hospitality room.

Vince asked for suggestions from club members for things they would like to do during the year as social events. He then told everyone present that we would be going to the Olive Garden after the club meeting for those interested in eating.

**VICE PRESIDENT COMPETITION:** Larry Gunter said QCCC has gotten an acknowledgement back from the Corvette Museum thanking us for our purchase of a brick. The brick will have QCCC's name on it.

He told all members present that he has received some information regarding a video tape about how to detail cars. If anyone is interested, he will give you the information to order one.

February 15, 1992, is the first event of the year. This event is being held by Beachcombers Corvette Club in Virginia Beach, Virginia, and will be a gimmick road rallye.

Larry once again reminded everyone about the regional banquet and the fact that we have to prepay if we are planning to attend. He asked that everyone present please pay their money that night if they were planning to attend.

He gave out 1989 and 1990 patches.

**OLD BUSINESS:** None.

**NEW BUSINESS:** It was mentioned that NCRS was holding a car show in Cypress Gardens January 26 and 27.

The Bylaws change proposal regarding a meeting day change that was published in the newsletter was read. The vote was held. The proposal did not carry because it did not have a two-thirds majority vote.

Clayton Williams made a motion that the club set aside \$2,000 to be contributed to N. C. Spina Bifida Assoc. for use in their family fun weekend to be paid in September, 1992, or shortly before the event. It was second by Don Yost. There was a discussion held about it.

Mike Catoe made a motion that we table the first motion, and it was second. This motion came to a vote. There were not enough votes in favor of this motion for the original motion to be tabled, so the original motion was brought to a vote.

The club voted by a two-thirds majority to set aside \$2,000 for the N. C. Spina Bifida Association.

A motion was made and second that the meeting be adjourned.
