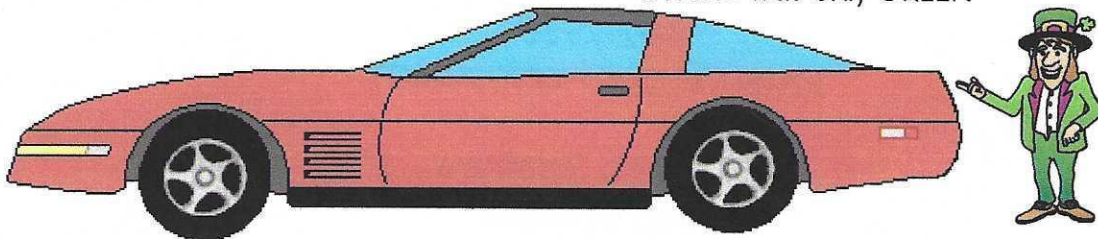

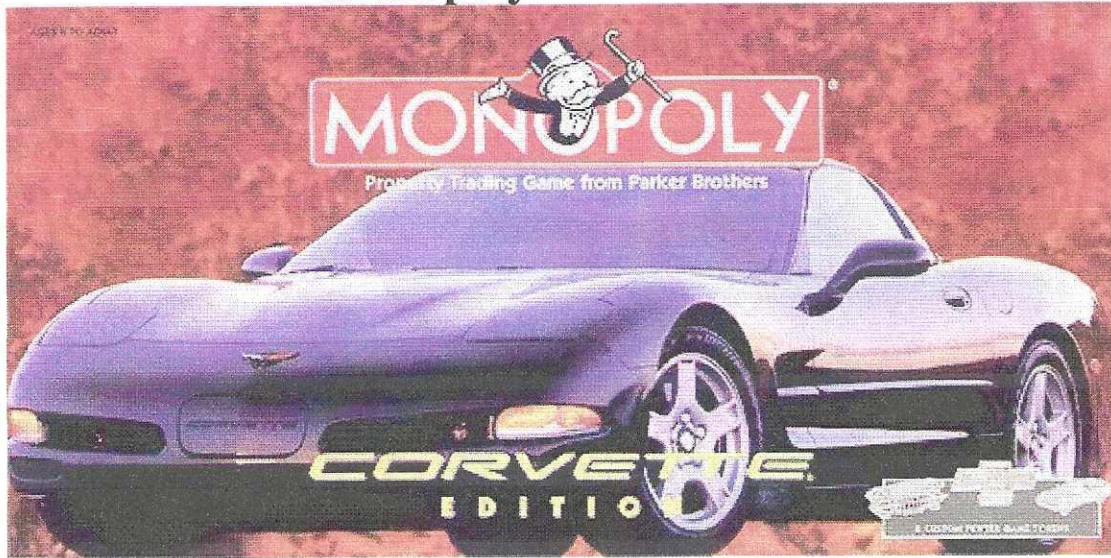

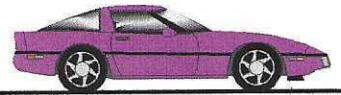

St. Patrick's Day Parade
Saturday, March 13, 1999
Parade Formation Information

Parade Route: NOTE THIS IS A CHANGE FROM LAST YEAR! The 1999 parade will start at Sixth and N. Tryon Streets. The parade will terminate and disperse from S. Tryon Street between Stonewall and Morehead Streets.

Parking: Free parking will be limited at both the start and finish of the parade. Groups are encouraged to car-pool. There are parking decks and surface lots available within one block of both ends of the parade. Parking is also available adjacent to the Irish Festival site at the First Union Atrium between 2nd and 3rd on College Street. The Irish Festival/First Union Atrium is roughly the middle of the parade route.

Check-In: Participants are asked to arrive between 10:30 and 11:15 am. The check-in table for group representatives will be located at Sixth and College Streets. Group representatives will receive their parade position and formation location from the registration table.

Starting Time: The parade will start promptly at NOON. Units not ready will be bypassed and reassigned to the rear of the parade if possible.

Along the parade route: Smile! Have fun! Enjoy the day! But, *City of Charlotte* officials have asked that "things" (like candy) not be thrown into the crowd. The *City of Charlotte* officials have also asked that parade units NOT stop in front of the grand stand.

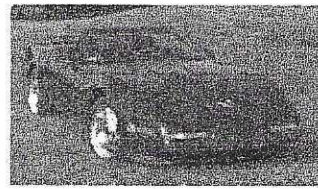
Who are you?: Although the city will not let units stop in front of the grand stand, we do want the crowd to know your group. The MC will announce the groups as they pass the reviewing stand so please forward group information for that purpose to FAX: 522-9728

Parade Marshall: For the safety of your group and others please use common sense while in the formation area and the parade route. Hibernians and Knights of Columbus members will be in the formation area and along the parade route to assist you. Please follow their instructions.

Well this is later.... 7 from Charlotte and 1 from Orlando were able to attend the Rolex 24. The attendees were John Meadows and his son Criss, Jon Elliott, Wendy and Walt Krupowicz, Steve Elliott, George Tilton and me. I am sorry you all could not have participated with us at this Rolex 24. It was a marvelous weekend. As usual our President out did himself getting us invited to the track, getting an invitation to the Chevrolet Suite for breakfast, and then getting us infield parking at the Eckler Corral. We had Beach Front accommodations, and a good seafood dinner Friday night. Saturday we went to the track (Daytona International Speedway) and was staged to participate in the parade lap prior to an awesome show of sports car racing. After the Parade Lap we were all escorted to Eckler's Corral where we had hot dogs and pop.

The Corvette was the Pace Car and Chevrolet had prepared two race cars. These were listed as C5R. They competed in the GT2 class against the Viper, and the Porsche. The race started at 1:00 PM on Saturday Jan. 30, 1999 and ended 24 hours later on Sunday the 31st. The race started similar to a NASCAR race with a bunch of yellow flags. Then the drivers settled down to some serious racing. Watching these drivers compete with 85 cars in 4 different classes on the track at the same time was a real lesson in driving skills. The Ferrari's, as I expected, lead the initial portions of the race. They were challenged by the R&S Fords, which I might add were very competitive. In fact at 9 AM Sunday they were leading the race with the number 7 Ferrari 2 laps back. However I am getting ahead of myself. Watching these cars and drivers maneuver through traffic and pass without many bruises... was a sight to behold. The fastest cars were usually still accelerating when the Can Am cars were starting to brake. The slower cars had to drive with one eye in the rear view mirror, and the fastest cars only had to look out for cars ahead of themselves. The guys that had real problems were the GT2 & GT3 cars. 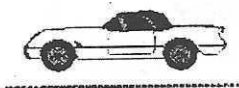

NCRS has judging events (Chapter, Regional, and National) throughout the U.S. where Corvettes from 1953 to 1982 are evaluated based on condition and originality. Some of the cars presented at these events are a sight to behold. While maintaining a Corvette to factory condition is not for everyone, just to see the cars is a real treat.

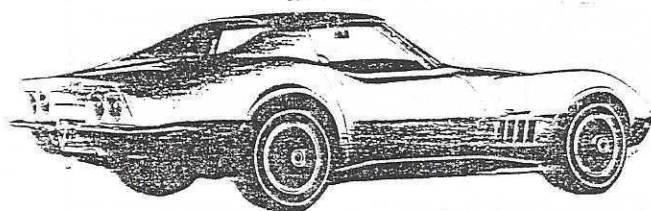
To attract those of us with 1984 and newer models, NCRS initiated a new award category-the SPORTSMAN award. This is a non- judged, strictly display only category, no worry about what the car will score. I believe the National office is presently developing judging criteria for the '84 and newer models. This should be real interesting. More to follow.

The Carolina Chapter of the National Corvette Restorers Society has a few events scheduled for this year. There are plans to have a judging event in Myrtle Beach on March 19 and 20. The Carolina Chapter will co-host the Southern Regional in Bowling Green, Kentucky on April 22-25. Wendy and I hope to drive out for this. The event will be on the Corvette Museum grounds. Plant tours will be available. Road tours to Monmouth Cave could be fun. but don't ask John Meadows!
