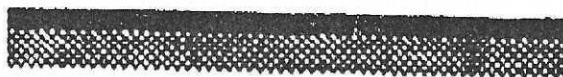
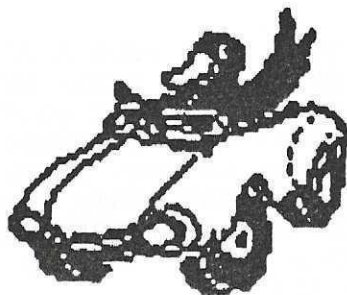
The social last month at the ROCKOLA was fun for everyone and we hope to have many more.

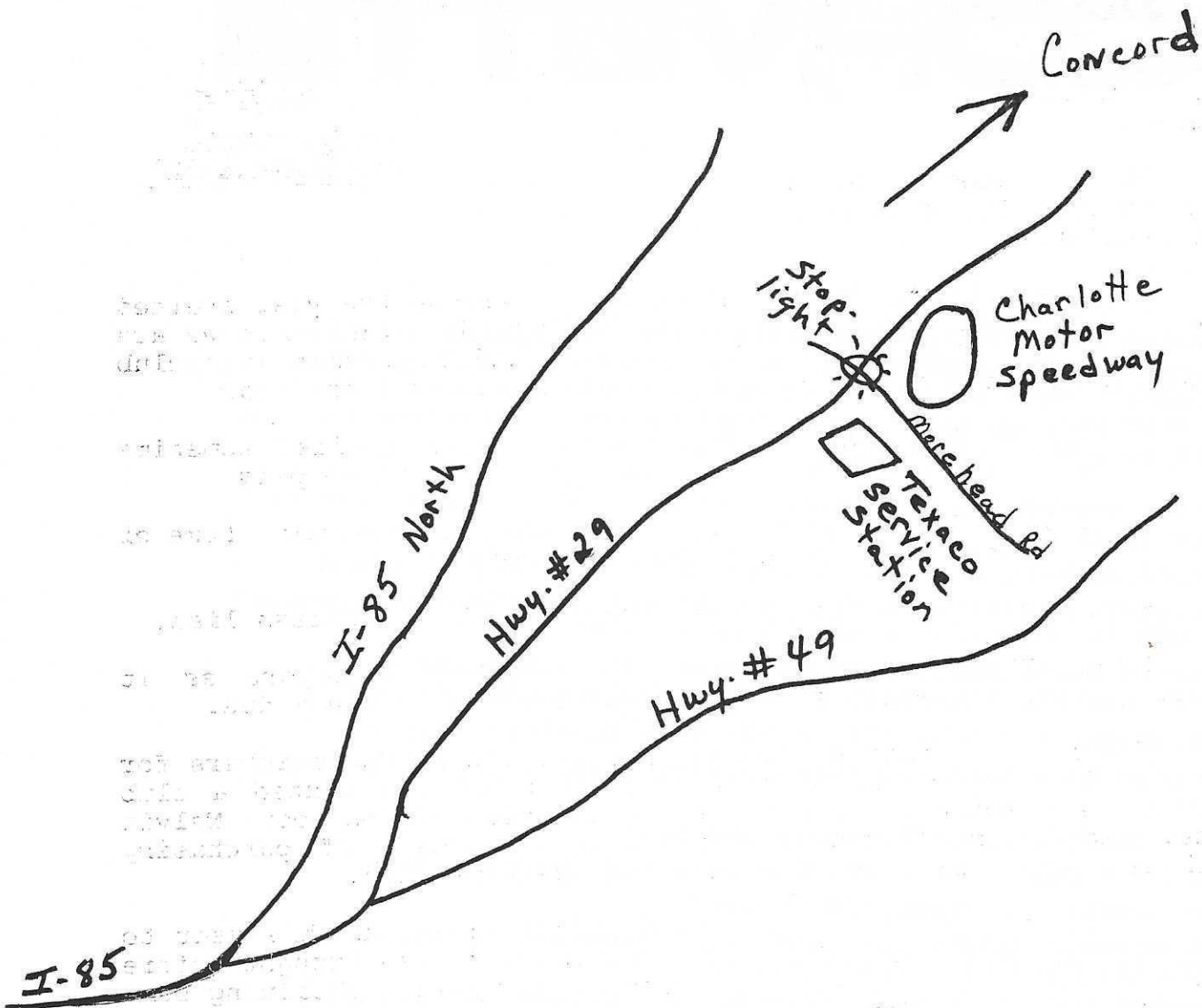
- .Record vendor and car corral registrations (a sell-out is anticipated)

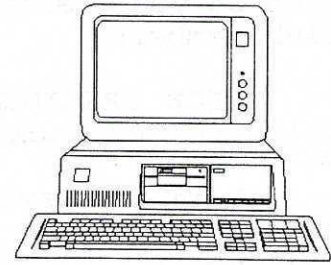

NEW BUSINESS: Zoe Hough is inviting everyone to her house on Sunday, February 14, for BBQ chicken and ribs at 12:00 p.m.

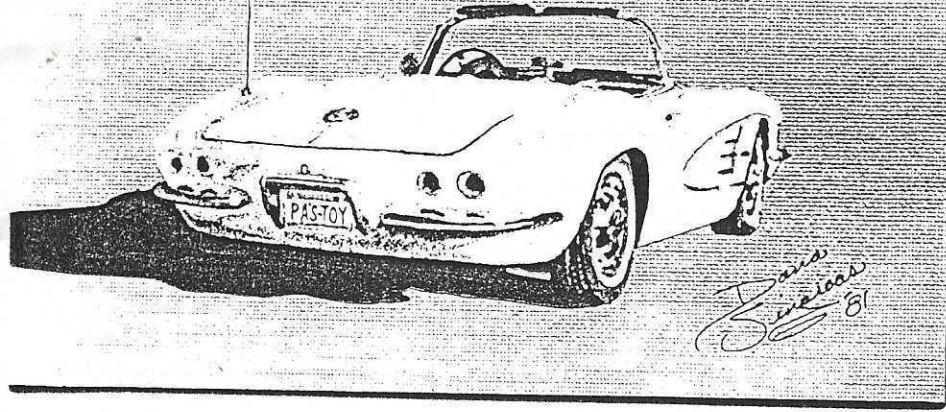
Thanks were given to Durran Coley for holding the meeting at the store.

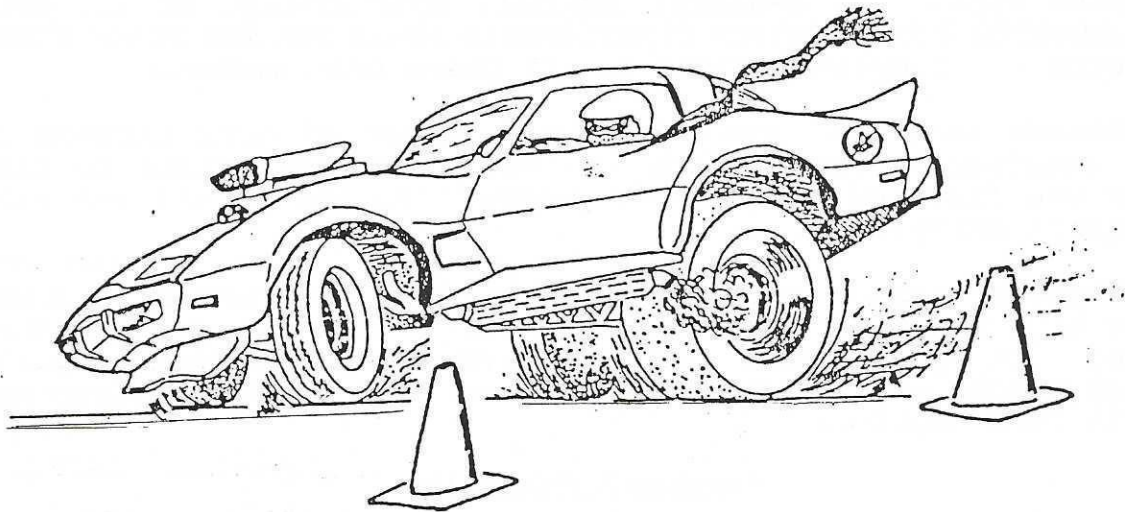

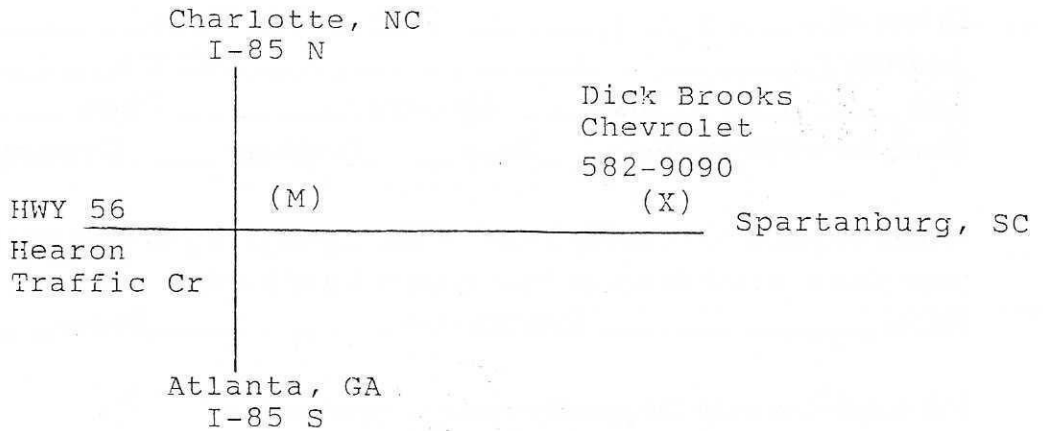
