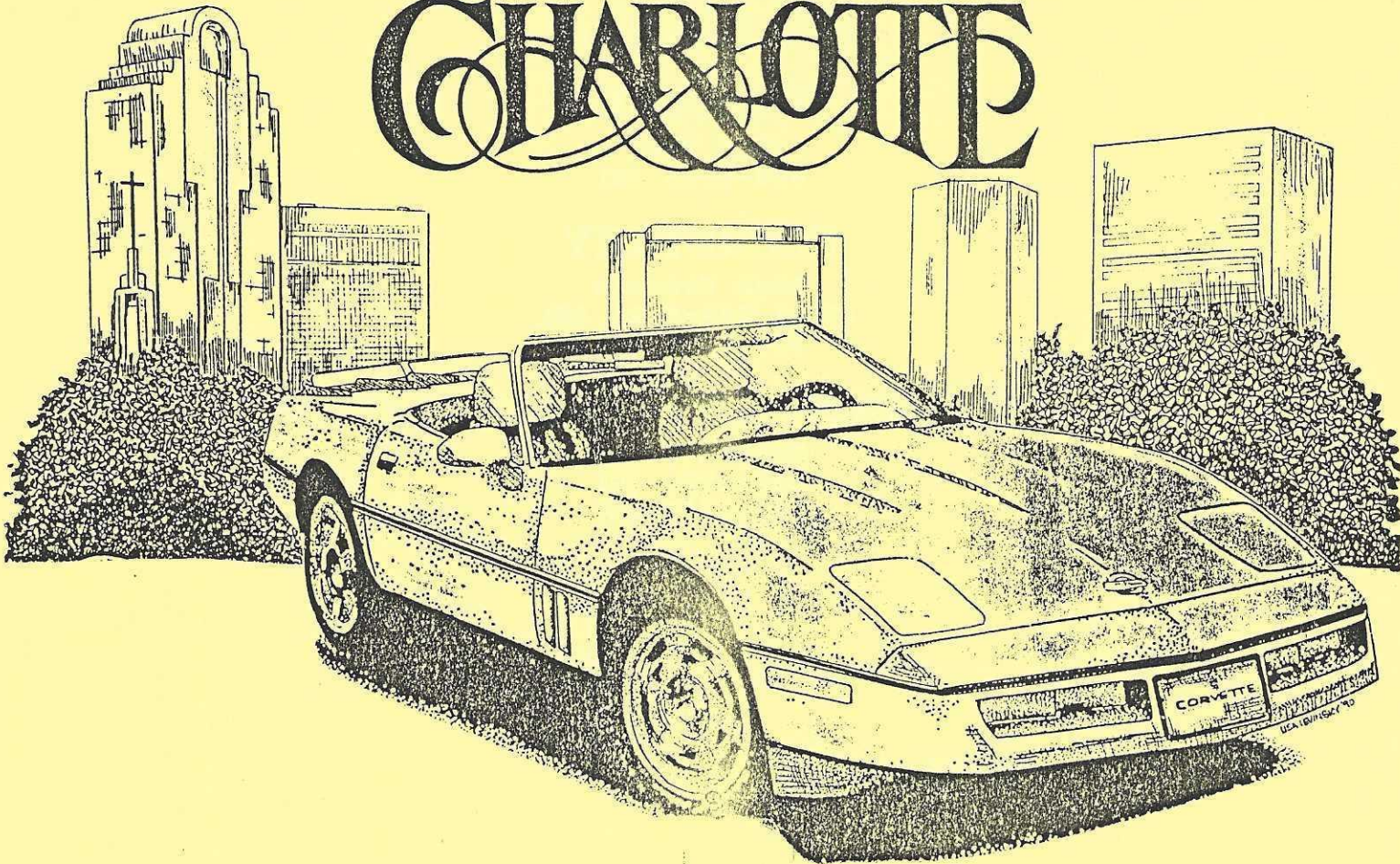

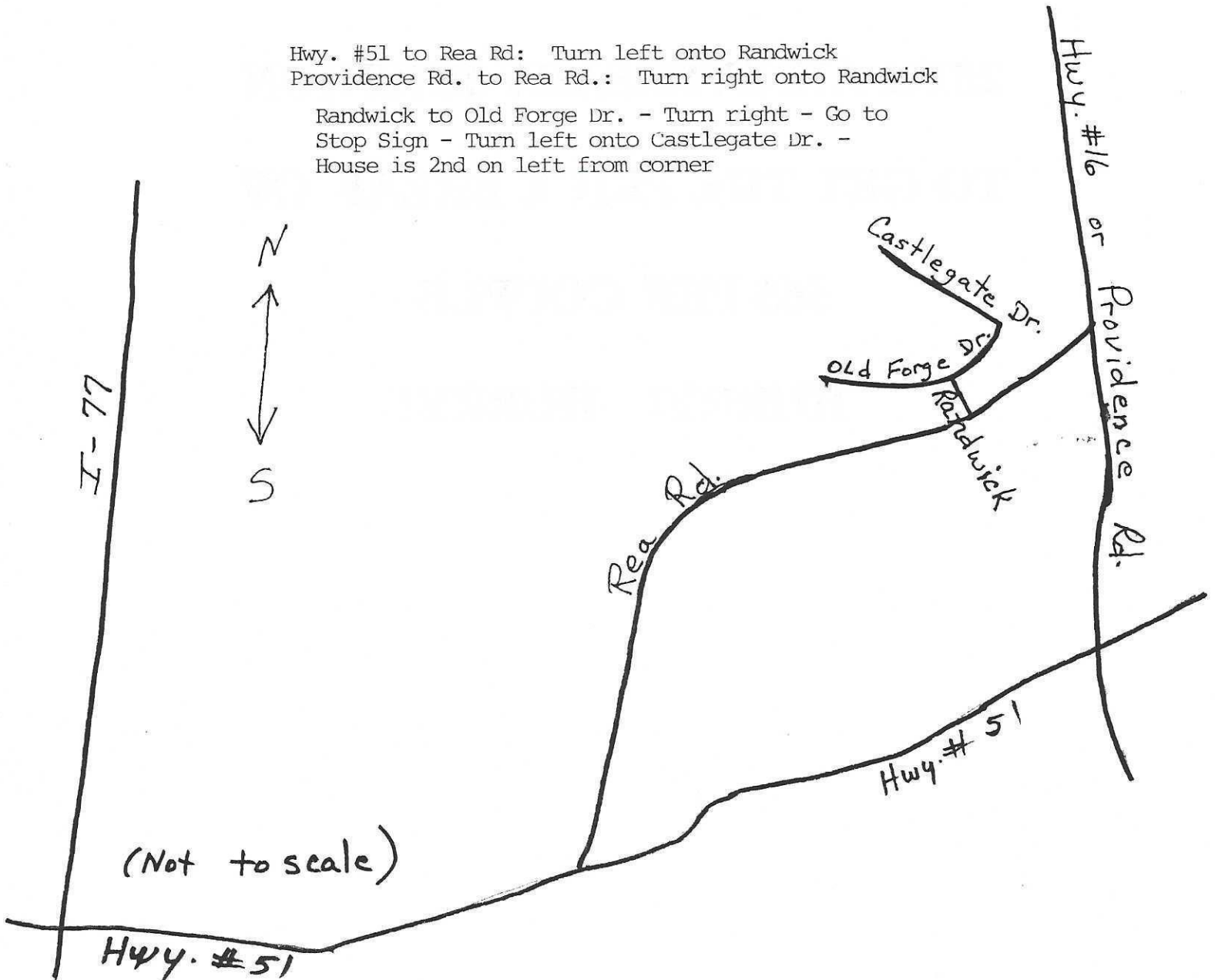

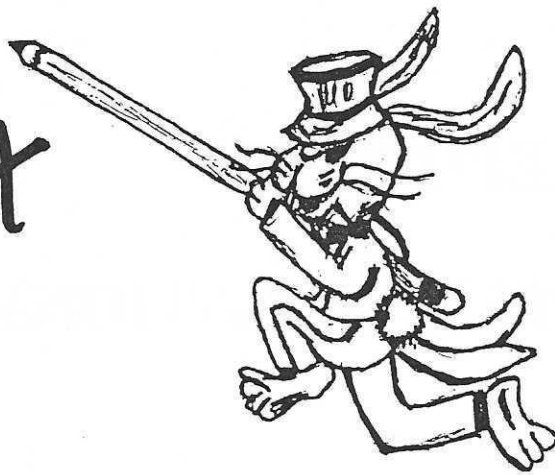

Chicken Enchilada Casserole

- 1 whole chicken 4-5 lbs., cooked, deboned, chopped
- 1 bottle Stevie's Italian Dressing (Harris-Teeter sells it.)
- 1 (10-oz.) bag tortilla chips, broken
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 (4-oz.) can diced green chilies
- 1 to 2 Tablespoons diced jalapeno peppers (I used more than this)
- 1 can cream of celery soup
- 1 can tomatoes, chopped
- 1-1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- Dash of chili powder (I sprinkled it all over top)

- * Boil chicken, debone, and chop into bite-size pieces. Pour about 3/4 bottle of the Stevie's Dressing over chicken and let it marinate about 30 minutes. Layer chips in bottom of 13x9-inch baking dish. Layer chicken on top of chips.

- * Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes or until bubbly.

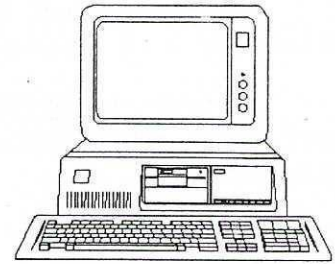

At the May meeting they will vote again on where the National meetings will be held, either Indianapolis again or Louisville, KY.

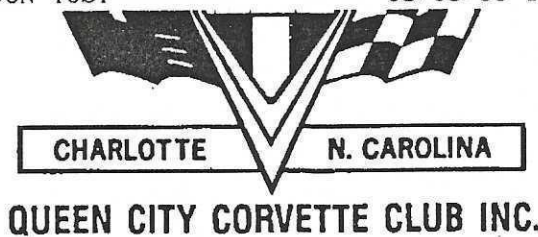
OLD BUSINESS: With regard to the boat cruise that was brought up some time back, we are looking into this and will update everyone some time in the future.
