WHO WE ARE

IN THE BEGINNING... In 1968 a few Corvette owners in Charlotte, NC got together to share stories about who had the fastest Corvette, the loudest exhaust, and how they could organize into a group to attract other Corvette owners in the area. They even had a club house off of Independence Boulevard, but it has long since been torn down to make way for Charlotte's ever-changing skyline.

The group started to grow and elected leaders. They had enough fun to remain together. On February 4, 1976 the Queen City Corvette Club (QCCC), was officially established as a 501© Non-Profit Organization - a Social and Recreational Club*. The purposes for which the corporation is organized, are stated in Article III of the QCCC Bylaws. Complete QCCC Bylaws are available on website www.queencitycorvette.com. QCCC is a Membership organization, primarily supported by dues and fees paid by the Members.

MEMBERSHIP

Queen City Corvette Club is one of the largest and most active Corvette Clubs in the Southeastern US with over 350 Members. Our Members range in age from 20s, all the way up to our senior Member who is 87-years young. Our Members own Corvettes from every series, C1 to C8. Some are award-winning showpieces, but most are daily drivers, because our Members know that the real fun of having a Corvette is driving it.

Our Membership continues to grow every month, and some of our newest Members have become very active in participating in club events. A number of QCCC Members from the 70s and 80s who may have had to sell their Corvette to raise a family, have then returned to the club continue on with the fun and camaraderie they remembered from years past. Other Members have relocated to our area and have been Corvette Club Members from other Corvette Clubs. There are also those who have purchased new Corvettes and just want to join in on the fun. Whatever your reason for joining, we're glad you did and hope you find your Membership rewarding.

QCCC GOAL

Our primary goal is to promote the ownership of, and further interest in, the Corvette. We promote the sport and pastime of safe motoring. QCCC strives to promote, sponsor, organize, and supervise Corvette outings, meetings, and competitions as well as other Corvette related-functions and events.

In addition to our own events, we participate in events sponsored by other Corvette Clubs. The bottom line is, we enjoy driving our Corvettes and wish to share the experience with friends made through QCCC Membership.

CHARITABLE WORK

QCCC helps raise money for local charities. Our great Members volunteer their time at these events to support the charities.

In the Fall we have our largest event. It is the *Annual Queen City Corvette Show*, held at the Hendrick Motorsports complex in Concord, NC. (See more information under "Car Shows.) We donate all funds raised, less expenses, to our various charities.

We also donate toys at Christmastime to the Salvation Army for the children in Charlotte. This charitable drive, run by the Victory Lane Corvette Club, is known as the Corvette Angel's Christmas Toy Drive. The event is held every December at the Charlotte Motor Speedway Club. It is coordinated by our Past President, Bill Cruthis.

CLUB STRUCTURE AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As with any organization, structure is important to ensure that club dues and budget are managed properly, making sure activities are planned and carried out, meeting locations are secured, and Members are provided timely information on all aspects of the club.

The QCCC Board of Directors is made up of volunteers who are elected annually by Membership voting. Nominations are presented in October and voting takes place in November each year. In addition to the Board, QCCC has many volunteers in Staff positions to perform critical functions, e.g., Newsletter Editor, Photographers, Charity Coordinator, Webmaster, Directory & Data Base Manager, National Corvette Museum Ambassador, and others. Staff positions are appointed by the Club President.

NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM AFFILIATION

QCCC is a Lifetime Business Member of the National Corvette Museum (wwwCorvetteMuseum.org) and our Members visit the museum and the nearby Corvette Assembly Plant in Bowling Green, KY on a regular basis. Many of our Members volunteer their time to work at the NCM during the events. QCCC donated over \$15,000 to purchase an acre of the now NCM Motorsports Park. Our club participates in the NCM BASH each April and also the Hall of Fame event in August where many new Corvettes are on display every year. At the BASH in April, GM and Assembly Plant personnel are in attendance and are always available to discuss the cars and hold informational workshops. Various seminars take place all weekend. This is probably the best four days you can spend to get the most information on new Corvettes. It is a must!

ANNUAL CLUB DUES

ACTIVITIES

The lifeblood of Queen City Corvette Club is Membership. Many of our events throughout the year are planned because Members suggest them. The QCCC Social Director and Automotive Director have the responsibility of planning the major annual events, trips, and auto shows. We strive to have events that will appeal to the greatest number of Members, but we also have smaller outings such as day trips to the North Carolina Mountains, cruise-ins to local ice cream shops, auto shows across the area, and many other events, including IMSA Racing Events, weekend beach trips, BBQ's, poker runs, parades, Cars & Coffee, and wine excursions throughout NC.

QCCC MEETINGS

Our monthly meetings take place on the 2nd Saturday of the month. They are held at nearby locations. Our meetings have been at Streetside Classics, RK Motors, SRI, Charlotte Motor Speedway Club, Auto Barn, Hopewell Presbyterian Church, and Hendrick Motorsports. Meetings are preceded by a one-hour social time, followed by a one-hour QCCC Meeting. Some meetings have dinner arrangements afterwards (e.g., Charlotte Motor Speedway Club) and require an RSVP.

Our meetings are important because they provide a forum for getting pertinent information to Membership about club events, Corvette technical information and Care & Compassion. <u>Up Yonder Dinner</u> - On the last Monday of the month there is the "Up Yonder Dinner". It is generally held in northern areas of Charlotte like Lake Norman, Mooresville, Cornelius, and Huntersville. Each month a QCCC Member volunteers to host the event and an email "blast" is sent out to all Members and Prospective Members with all the details on the restaurant. There are usually 40 to 50 people in attendance at this

dinner. RSVP is required by the deadline indicated, so the restaurant can have adequate seating and staff. Again, it is a great way to really get to know your fellow Members.

CAR SHOWS

QCCC sponsors Annual Car Shows with proceeds going to the charities we support. Some shows are for QCCC Members only, to shine and show their Corvettes.

Our 9th Annual Queen City Corvette Show will run jointly with our major sponsor, Rick Hendrick, and this year will be held October 3, 2020, at the Hendrick Motorsports complex. We are anticipating 400–500 Corvettes this year! We also share sponsorship with Bloomington Gold, who will judge late model Corvettes. Also, in attendance will be the National Corvette Museum and many other vendors selling their wares. We will need many QCCC volunteers to assist us on the many committees. As we get closer to the date in October, there will many updates at QCCC meetings by our President, Paul Mitchell and Auto Show Director, Tommy Loftin. QCCC DAY, OVERNIGHT, and WEEKEND CRUISES

QCCC organizes several excursions throughout the year for Members. Some are weekend events, some just overnight, and some are day cruises to different attractions within a reasonable driving distance. Trips are announced in advance with details on departure time

and place, route, lodging, meals etc., provided at club meetings and through emails. Some events may have limited attendance due to space/parking/room constraints, so signing up early offers you the best chance to enjoy that activity. There are often waiting lists.

Travel tips should you decide to go on one of these trips:

- Communication is important. Most Members have a two-way radio and its set on Channel 7 (FRS or an FRS/GMRS are recommended radios used to communicate with each other during a trip. Radios can be purchased at Best Buy, Walmart, Amazon, or eBay).
- Share your cell phone number with the trip organizer or with those on the trip so you
 can communicate with each other during the caravan, especially when your out of radio
 range.
- Some of the hotels, like the Hilton Garden in Bowling Green KY, offer a car wash place to clean the road grit off your Corvette. You may want to bring your own car wash kit, pail, washing products, and of course towels. If you have any questions on what to bring just ask one of the Members.

NCM MOTORSPORTS PARK

IN 2014, the NCM held the Grand Opening of the Motorsports Park facility in Bowling Green, KY. This facility is one of the most centrally located and easily accessible driving facilities in the country. It is being funded by Corvette enthusiasts, NCM Members and Corporate Sponsors. Designed with features such as the Mulsanne Straight, Porsche curves, and the Corvette corner from LeMans, it will replicate elements from the greatest race in the world. It is also the home of the Corvette Racing Team, and the NCM will afford us the opportunity to observe some of their practice sessions and meet the Corvette Racing Team when they're in town. NCM - CARAVAN - NC/SC/VA

Every 5 years, the National Corvette Caravan, is held to commemorate events in the history of the National Corvette Museum and the Corvette. The first Caravan was held in 1994 to celebrate the opening of the NCM and again in 1999 to celebrate the NCM 5th Anniversary.

In 2003, a 3rd Caravan was organized to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Corvette. In 2009, the 4th Caravan celebrated NCM's 15th Anniversary and brought approximately 6,000 Corvettes and enthusiasts.

The 5th Corvette Caravan celebrated the 20th NCM Anniversary which was the exciting Grand Opening of the NCM Motorsports Park Complex.

The 6th Corvette Caravan was the 25-year anniversary of the NCM and was the biggest and best yet. Countless thousands of Corvettes participated to get their first in-person look at many of the brand new C8! Because our local Carolinas and Virginia segment of the caravan departed from the Charlotte area, QCCC played a major role in the planning, organizing, and execution of the caravan. The 7th National Caravan coordination, has already started. The exact dates TBD; we will inform you as soon as we have the information. You will want to be a part of this historical event.

ANNUAL QCCC BBQ / HOMECOMING

In October of every year, QCCC celebrates our annual *BBQ* held at Davidson's Ranch. This event has become a QCCC Homecoming because so many of our Members and guests attend to partake of this delicious BBQ with all the trimmings.
