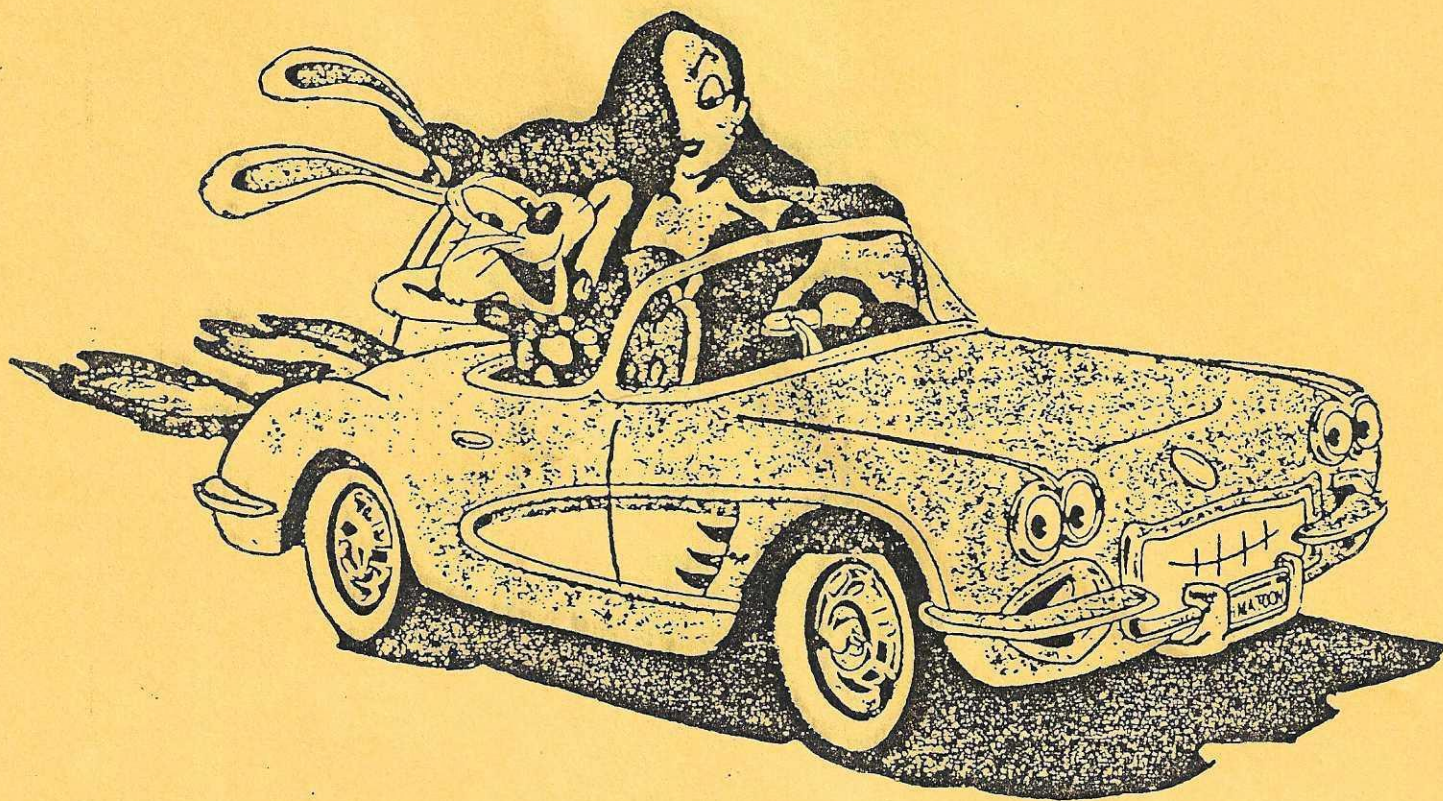

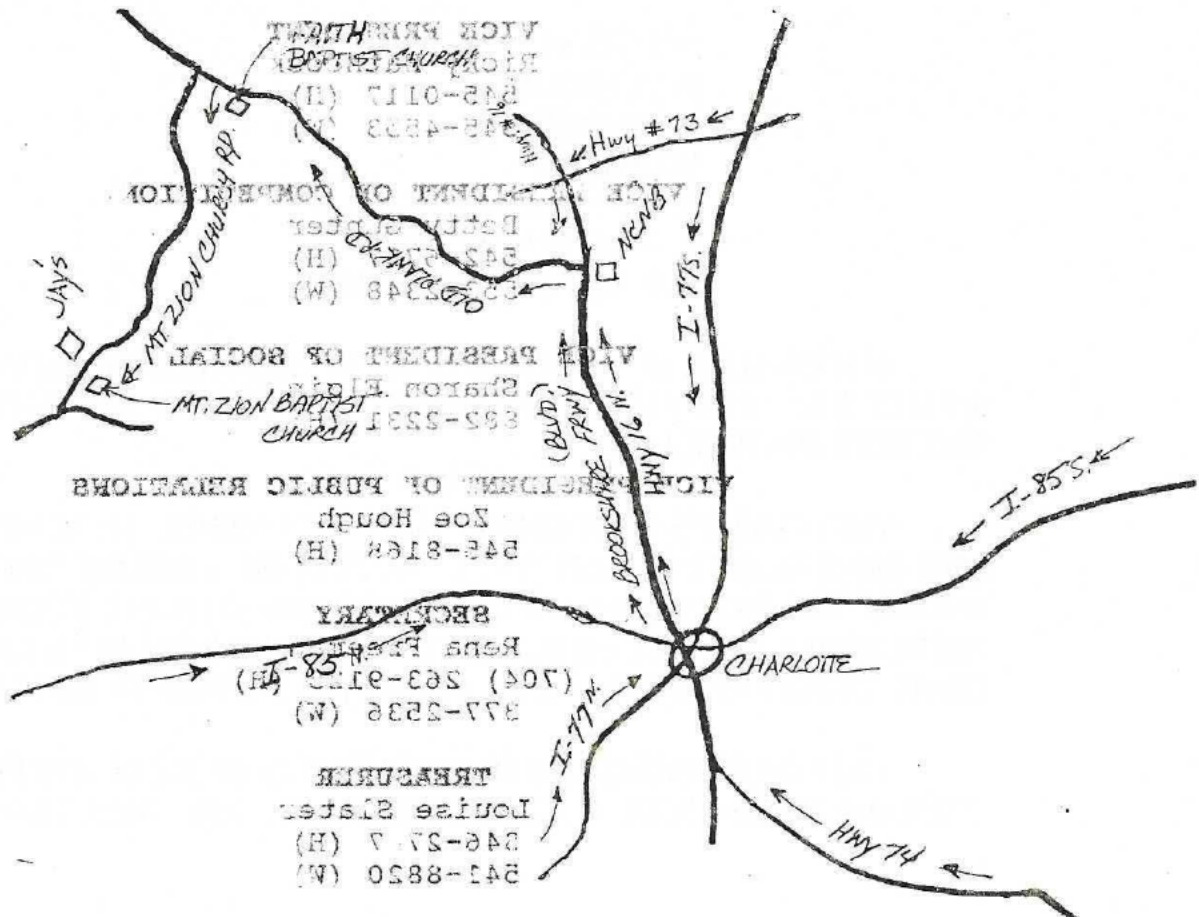

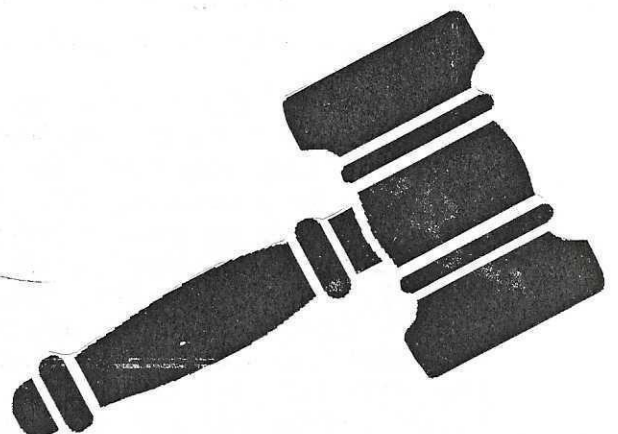

Nominations for next year's officers are this month. Make it a point to be at there for this important meeting. Your opinion is important to the entire club.

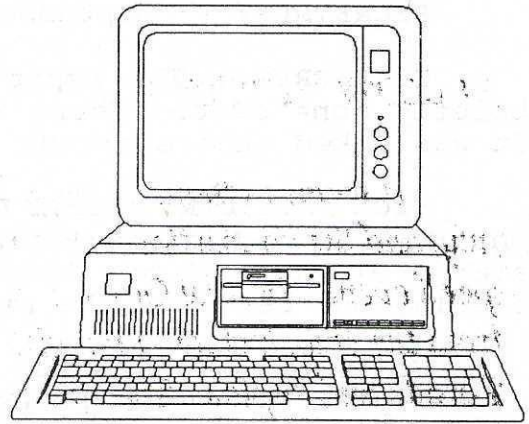

SEPTEMBER 7, 1991, MINUTES

QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB MEETING

The meeting was called to order, and the roll was called. There were 19 members present and 8 visitors. The visitors were welcomed by the President. Visitors Todd and Cindy Cantor and Steve and Jeanne Martin told the President that they wished to be voted on as new club members.



VICE PRESIDENT COMPETITION: Betty Gunter told the club there would be a Carolina Region Governor's Meeting on September 8 and that the offices of Regional Executive and Regional Competition Director were open because Larry Gunter and Jay Freeman were not going to run for re-election. Starting in 1992, the National Meetings will be held at Indianapolis, IN.

The National Meetings are being held in Nashville, TN, on September 13 and 14; Spina Bifida Family Weekend is being held at Camp Carefree on September 21. We are to meet at McDonald's at W. T. 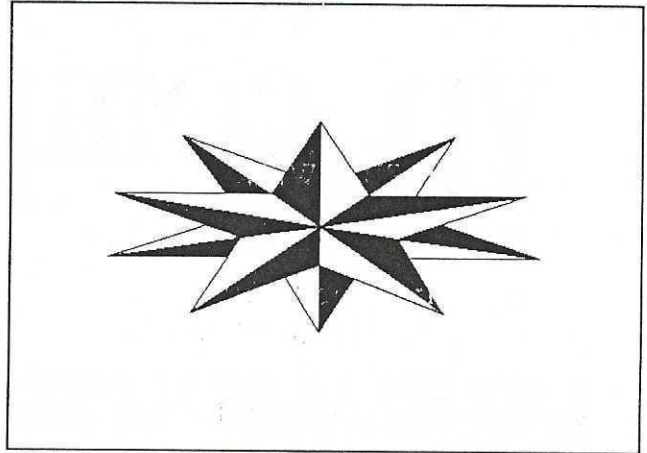

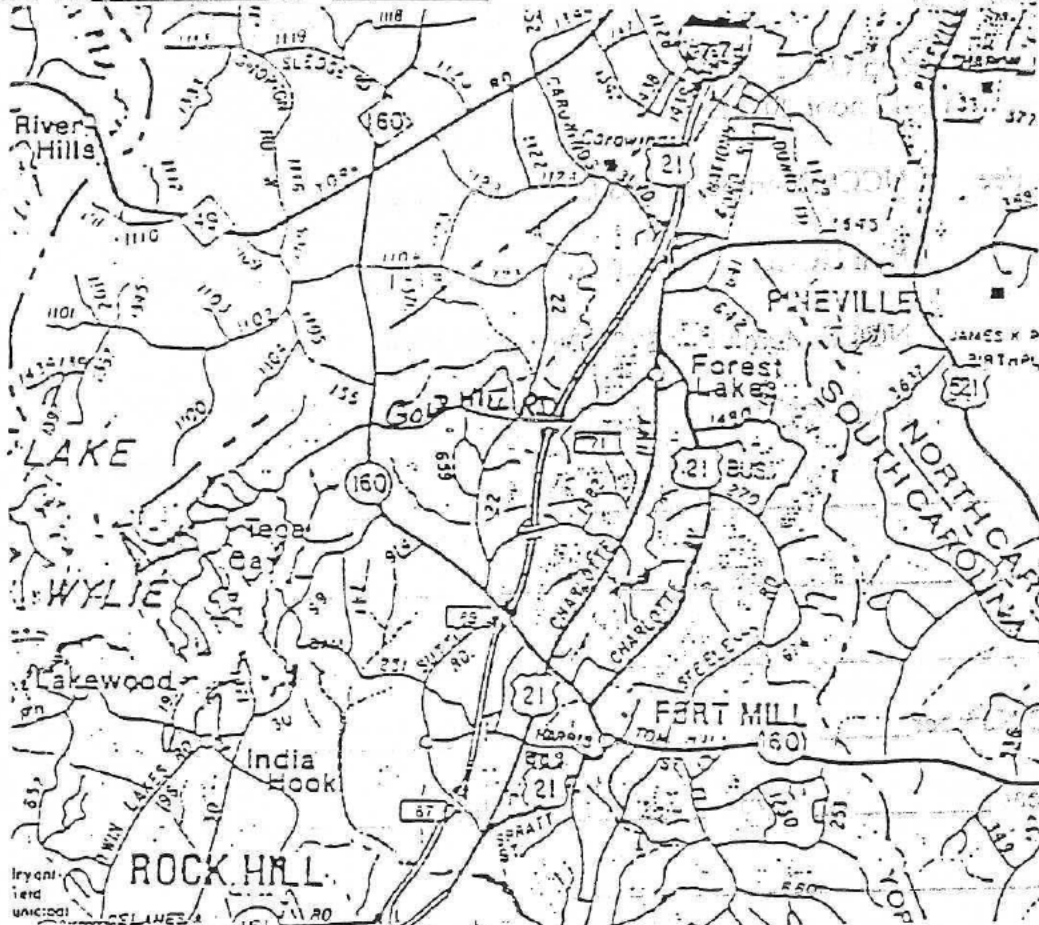


