along with Travis Meredith and Tommy Mitchem, will attend our officers' meeting on September 28.

We will also have a 25th Anniversary planning meeting after our club meeting on Saturday, October 10. Everyone is welcome to stay and attend this meeting if they want to. Everyone's help is needed in helping us find some of the past club members.

VICE PRESIDENT OF SOCIAL: In Vince Sciabica's absence due to his move to Albany, NY, it has been decided that Debbie Catoe, Anna and Durran Coley, and Maureen Yost will help Vince fulfill his office of V.P. of Social for the remainder of the year.

VICE PRESIDENT COMPETITION: Larry Gunter said events are listed in your newsletter along with regional and national standings. We need your participation.

Further, Chairman, Co-chairman, nor Worker points count towards the Concours Award since the other members of the Host Club cannot enter the event.

Further, Chairman, Co-chairman, and Worker points will count as entrant points.

Our sanctioned fun rallye for December 5 will be held in Kernersville, NC. Ruth Risdon will be the event chairperson.

OLD BUSINESS: Car trailer specifications...

1. If truck & trailer exceed 10,001 lbs, trailer has to have safety equipment (brakes and breakaway safety switch).
2. NC is exempt from Federal Motor Carriers' safety regulations if no commerce is taking place.
3. If trailer alone exceeds 4,000 lbs gross weight, it has to be state inspected.

4. If we go into other states, we need to check for safety equipment exemptions.
5. Noncommercial vehicles do not have to go through weigh stations.

NEW BUSINESS: Durran Coley gave out maps of the Auto Fair layout. He said that everyone needed to be back at CMS by 6 P.M. Sunday to pick up their car.

Nominations for 1993 club officers will be made at the next club meeting. If you want to be an officer next year, please let one of the current officers know so you can be nominated.

The next officers' meeting is scheduled for September 28 at 7:30 p.m. at Larry and Betty Gunter's house.

The next club meeting is scheduled for Saturday, October 10, at 5:00 p.m. at Clayton and Ruth Williams' Corvette Condo.

The superlative awards that have been given each year at the awards banquet are being studied to see if they need to be changed or dropped.

Ricky Hathcock made a motion to let the officers decide what would be the best thing for the club to do for Christopher Dickson in the way of a gift, etc. It was second by Teresa Tilton.

A motion was made and second that the meeting be adjourned.

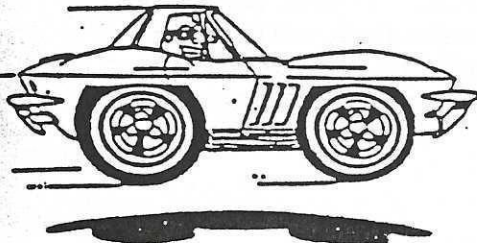
WOOOOW CHECK-UP
