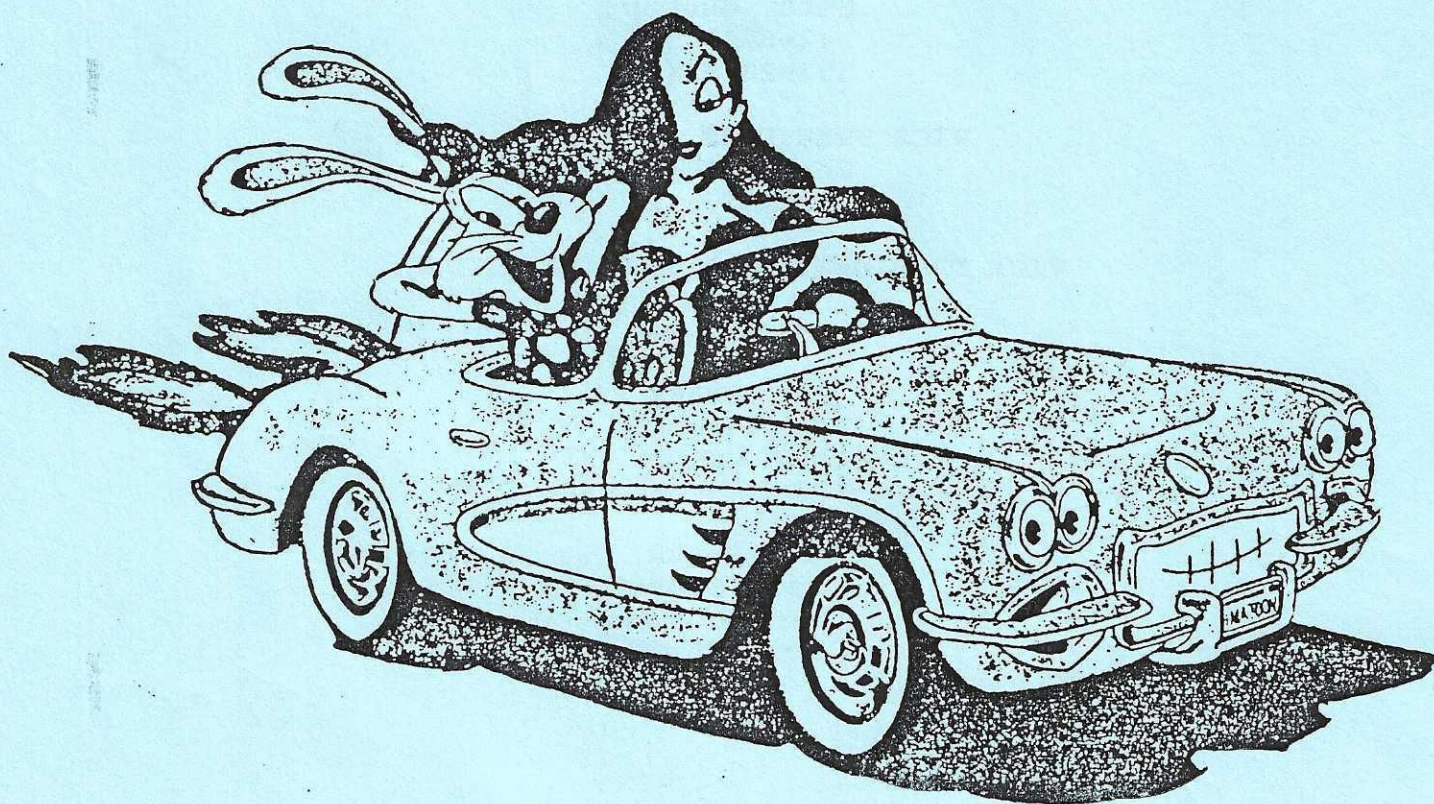

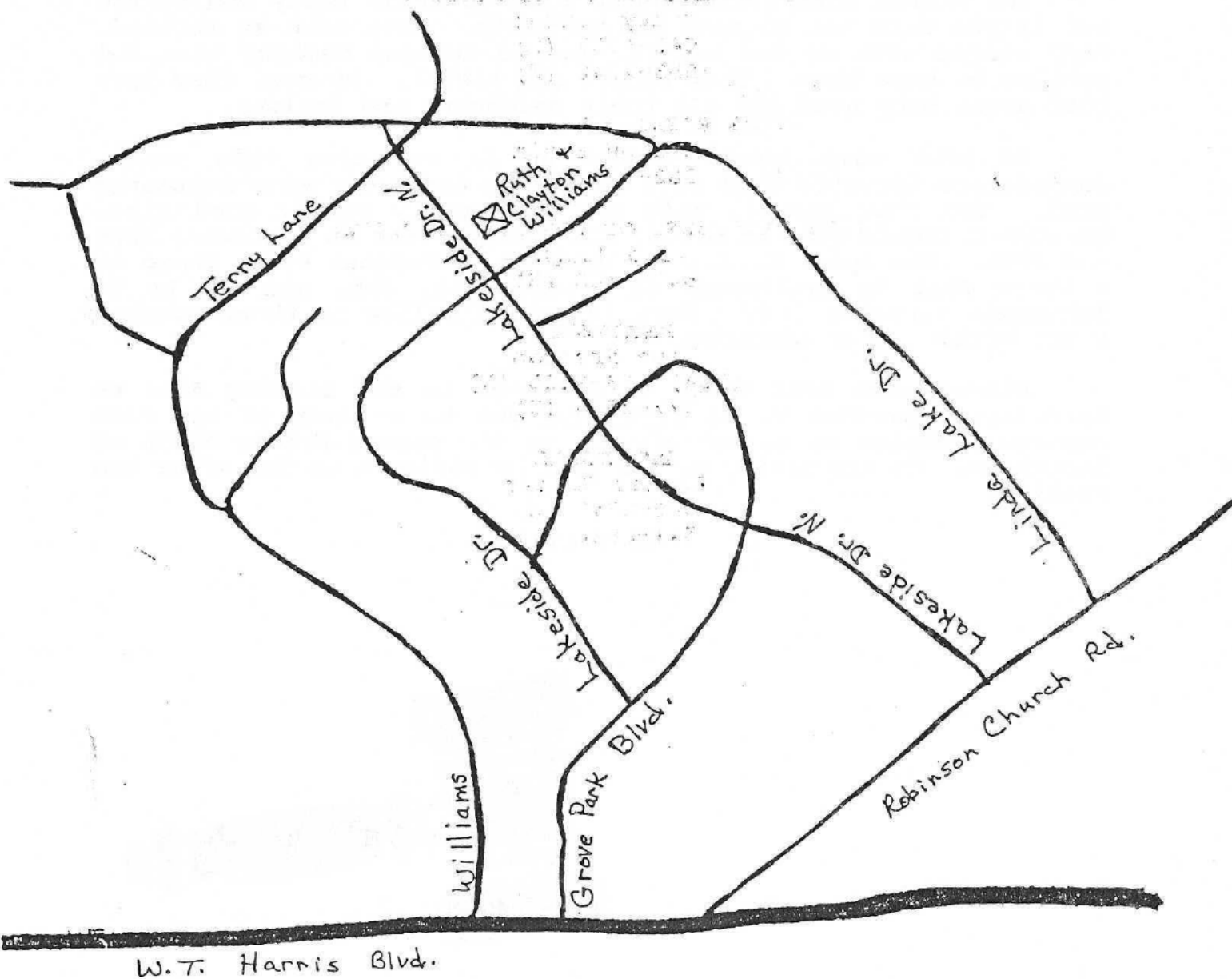

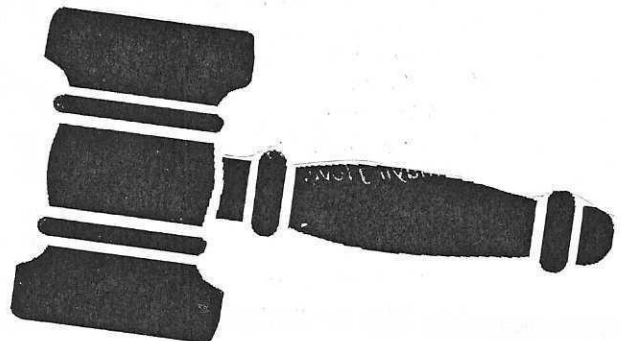

We are still receiving nice compliments about Convention. Thanks again for a job well done.

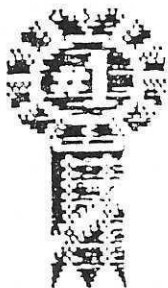

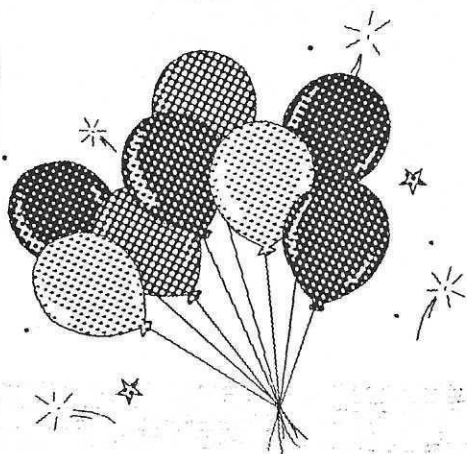

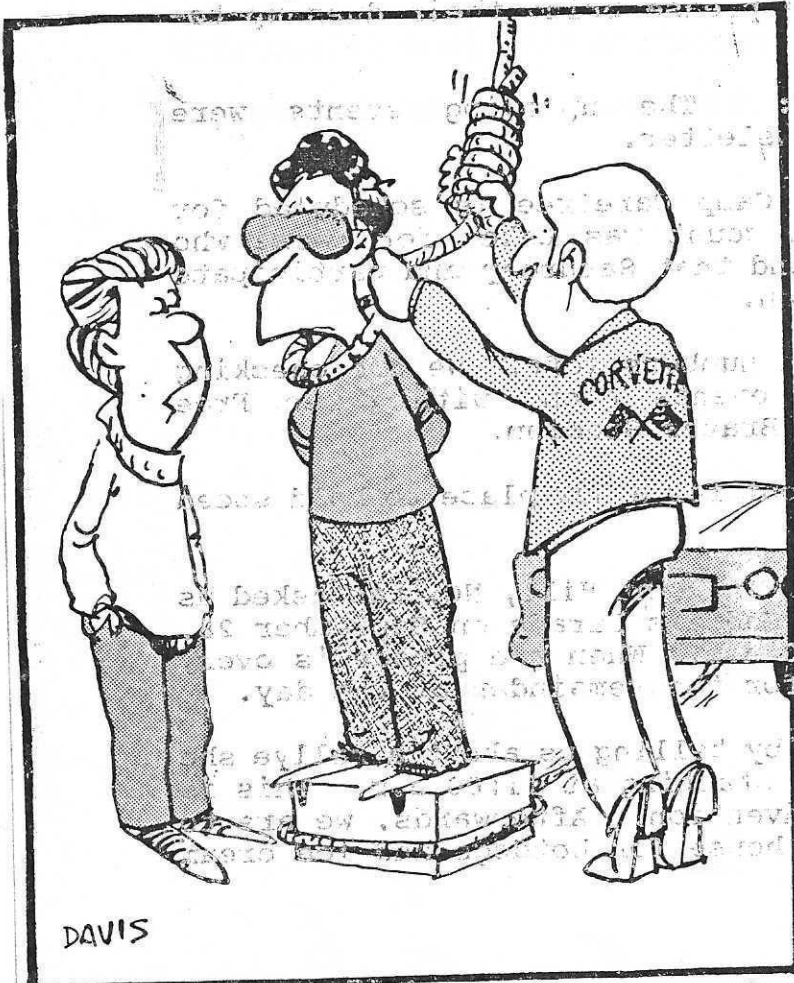

VICE PRESIDENT COMPETITION: The upcoming events were discussed that appeared in the newsletter.

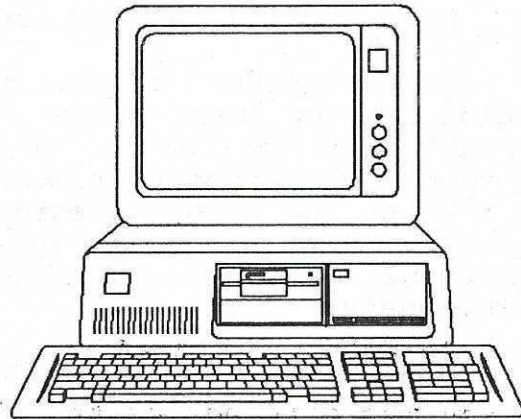
